A New Year With Christ

Begin 2019 with Christ Jesus! Write it down... say it out-loud...but above all take it to heart! A new year means new beginnings. A new year is a fresh start. But a new year with Christ means our lives rest on the foundations of our Savior's love and mercy. We all make New Year's resolutions with the hope our lives will change for the better. However personal resolutions have a "iffy" track record, don't they? But the love of God in Christ, never fails! Why?

Listen to the angel who spoke to Joseph, the foster-father of Jesus, "He will save His people from their sins." That is what the name, Jesus means in Greek: "He saves". January 1st maybe the start of a new year on the regular calendar but January 1st on the church calendar commemorates the Name of Jesus, "He who saves!" In Luke 2, it is stated, "At the end of eight days, when He was circumcised, He was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before He was conceived in the womb." Jesus' circumcision was a sign of things to come! A sign of what Jesus came to do. Jesus came to put Himself under the Law by shedding His blood through circumcision. Jesus fulfilled the Law for us and washed every dirty sin away with His blood upon the cross.

In every sense of the word, we can say 2019 means you have a *new you* in Jesus' name! *That new you* began at your baptism. *That new you* grows and becomes strong through the Word and Sacraments. *That new you* we all received by faith, looks for ways to love and serve in thanks and praise, as the Lord Jesus has served us with His salvation.

So what are you going to do with *this new you* in this New Year? January/February are months to grow in faith and in service to Christ and one another,

at St. Paul. Growth in faith comes in the form of *The Winter Book Festival*. Inside are details about the festival. What is a book festival all about and why is it important? Maybe you've seen or read about cities, communities and organizations that sponsor book festivals across the country. A Book Festival or Book Read helps in the following ways: *It makes us think. It builds community. It sparks discussion. And it also helps us grow in the grace of Christ together. We begin to speak from the same page.* Last year's *Winter Book* Festival was great. Pastor is hoping the same will be true this year. New this year is the opportunity to pick what you want to read! See the display in the fellowship hall. Service to Christ and one another is also important. We need folks to help with Altar Guild, Usher/Greeters and the Food Pantry. Likewise a big thank you goes out to those who work behind the scenes to keep things going here at St. Paul. Many things (like heating/opening the church, flowers, banners, maintenance etc.) are done week by week as we gather for worship. This is work we don't ordinarily see but work which is very much needed. All work, all services, all gifts of time, talent and treasure are important in our congregation. Why? They are gifts to His Church through which our Lord preserves and extends His Kingdom of Grace among us. As Jesus serves us with the gifts of forgiveness and redemption; we are His people who serve Him and each other out of thanks and praise.

As you set your sights on a brand new year... remember the new you that is you in Christ. Are there ways you can help? Are there ways you can serve? Ways to help, opportunities to serve will appear in church bulletins and church newsletters this year just as it has in the past. Instead of thinking, "somebody else" or saying, "who me?" remember the words of the hymnist Daniel March, "Let none hear you idly saying, 'there is nothing I can do," while the souls of men are dying and the Master calls for you! Take the task He gives you gladly. Let His work your pleasure

be. Answer quickly when He calleth, 'Here am I, send me, send me!"" LSB 826v.4. All it takes is a willing heart motivated and strengthened by Christ and setting time aside to do it. If age and limitations prevent us from being active as we would like...you can still pray! Pray for God's Kingdom to come, pray for God's people to give them the strength and where withal. All of us have something to give that we have been given by Christ our Savior to His praise and glory and for the benefit of one another. Paul sums it up best when he wrote, "I appeal to you brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your minds...that you may discern what is the will of what is good, acceptable God, perfect." (Romans 12:1-2) Remember that God's love in Christ for you and with you, will not fail you in this New Year through Christ!

Prayer: O Lord, we do not know what 2019 will bring, but You, O Lord do know. All things including ourselves are under Your care, protection and love. You still come to us in Word and Sacraments. The Holy Spirit comes to fill us with Your love and strength. We thank You for all the gifts that You give to Your Church and our congregation! Continue to bless us with joy and peace. Make us strong to serve as You so willingly served us with life and salvation. May 2019 be a year of blessings to us and through us, in Your holy Name, Amen.

Winter Book Festival Coming

This coming January-February 2019, St. Paul's Winter Book Festival returns. New this year is the opportunity to vote on a selection you would like to read! Pastor has three choices for this year's festival:

"Christ Have Mercy: How To Put Your Faith In Action" by Matthew Harrison (CPH) 272 pages

Mercy—the mercy of Christ to and for us—and our demonstration of that mercy to those within and outside the Body of Christ is the key to the future of the Church, to mission and stewardship, to living our Christian lives together in love and forgiveness, to moving boldly and confidently into the future with courage in the Gospel.—from the Preface

For two thousand years Christians have echoed the pleas of blind men and beggars, "Christ, have mercy!" These words are part of the historic liturgy (the Kyrie) and have been sighed on deathbeds and in sick rooms and after natural and man-made disasters. But what does it mean to ask our Lord and Savior for mercy? And what about Christ's command to be merciful, even as God has been merciful to us? Through Scripture study, real-life experiences, and the writings of Lutheran Church Fathers, Christ Have Mercy urges Christians to consider the innumerable opportunities we have to show mercy—to fellow Christians and to anyone God places in our path. (Includes Study Guide)

"Grace Upon Grace: Spirituality For Today" by John W. Kleinig (CPH) 287 pages

Christian spirituality is, quite simply, following Jesus. It is the ordinary life of faith in which we receive Baptism, attend the Divine Service, participate in the Holy Supper, read the Scriptures, pray for ourselves and others, resist temptation, and work with Jesus in our given location here on earth." - from the Introduction

spiritual frustration, is common among Christians. Do we read and study the Bible enough? Do we worship often and in the right way? Do we pray enough, in the correct way, and for the right things? How do we become truly spiritual?

And the answers from numerous self-help spirituality books only lead to confusion and the fear of missing key steps on the road to becoming spiritual. In response, John W. Kleinig clarifies that there is no process for becoming spiritual. Instead, God graciously gives to us every spiritual gift that we need, beginning with the very gift of faith in Christ, our Savior. Because God has joined us to Christ, He during Sunday Morning Bible Study. The discussion continually comes to give us life.

"Echo: Unbroken Truth Worth Repeating, Again" by Jonathon Fisk (CPH) 328 pages

Christianity is not the ability to memorize or recite from books of Scripture or doctrine. It is not magic. It is not social club, counseling group, or self-help support group. It does not promise that you will be healthy, wealthy, wise, or even happy. Christianity is a truth—a truth first heard at the beginning of time that has echoed to this present age. A truth so profound that no man can master it, yet even a child can learn it...Jonathan Fisk introduces his readers to that truth. He lays it out as simply as a child counts to ten on his fingers. Yet, training to hear the Echo, the reader will come to understand the wisdom that Fisk imparts is bottomless. Fisk teaches nothing less than the distilled, unbreakable Christian Echo, the very thing which has radically changed humanity in every nation and tongue that it has ever been repeated. It the most astoundingly complete description of what life is and why it is worth living. And it's worth repeating. Again.


